Funding Scope

We welcome applications for The Pandemic Institute (TPI) Emerging Threats: Monkey Pox Pump-Priming Call. Applications for projects with budgets up to £30,000 are invited from investigators based at TPI founding partner institutions.

Successful Applications will demonstrate reasonable cohesion with The Pandemic Institute domains (Predict, Prevent, Prepare, Respond, Recover) as evaluated by the review panel.

Activity should be broad and high risk, pump-priming activities are welcomed. Specific activities may include (but not limited to):

Glossary of Terms

Directly Incurred (DI)	Directly Incurred costs are those items that are specifically purchased for the project. These are charged on the basis of the cash amount spent and are verifiable and auditable from the accounting records. Examples include; <i>Staff - e.g. project-specific PDRAs, non-pool technicians, Travel, Equipment, Consumables</i>
Directly Allocated (DA)	Directly Allocated staff are principal academics, co-investigators and departmental support staff that are funded full-time by the employing institution and many funding schemes allow salaries to be subsidised with a %salary recovery cost
